The down ballot state candidates will have an ongoing effect on our licensing, inspectors and state labor law issues. Anyone who goes back 20 years in the trade will remember what things were like before candidates that we support put our licensing laws thru. Door lock monitoring, safety testing and many of the other things that we do now are all a result of laws put in place by legislature. They benefit our employers, our members and the riding public. A few sessions ago we had an anti-labor governor and legislature. They hurt us and our employers in a number of ways.

They took the school construction out of the prevailing wage laws. This allowed low paying, out of state companies to underbid our local signatory contractors who pay us a fair wage. This is just one of many ways they harmed labor.

It is important to know that the committee doesn't go by the candidate's ads or what they say in order to make these decisions. We also don't consider their political party.

We go thru the record of how the candidate has voted on paper, on the record in the legislature. The committee also has people who work full time in legislature lobbying for issues that are important to working families. They see how the candidates work with our issues and what they fight for first hand.

They let the delegates on the panel know how the candidate represented labor. State and local candidates also have to appear before the panel to answer questions. If they don't show they can't be considered for endorsement.

It's important to know that the delegates only question them on where they stand on labor issues. They don't get involved with immigration, abortion, gun control or anything other than labor. Those things are up to the voters to consider when they decide what's most important to them.
