Work Picture

As apprentices are completing their courses and passing the Mechanic Exam, more Assistant Mechanic Agreements are being signed.

Continuing Education

If you completed your Mechanic Exam after July 9, 2022, you must complete 8 hours of Continuing Education. NEIEP has created an online course and it is available at NEIEP.org. Once you have completed the course, you will receive 8 hours of the local mechanic rate. Do not confuse this requirement with the required Continuing Education to maintain your CCCM; these are different courses. If you were a Mechanic before July 9, 2022, you can take the offered Continuing Education course and you will also receive the 8 hours of local mechanic rate. This requirement for new mechanics is new to our Collective Bargaining Agreement. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call.
